HIM Students need to complete one course with a Non-US focus. Examples include: Cultural Anthropology, European History, World Religions, and Foreign Languages. Hispanic and Latino Studies are not considered a Non-US focus.

HIM PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

There are specific requirements that you must meet to be eligible for the HIM program at Regis University. Please see the following eligibility requirements:

- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale. (Note: Applicants with a GPA below 2.0 will be considered on an individual basis by the Department of Health Services Administration.)
- Completion of Anatomy & Physiology I & II (no lab required), Computer Literacy and English Composition (or equivalent) prior to the HIM curriculum.

HIM courses take 24-30 months; individuals who already possess the Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) credential or coding certificate may be awarded credit for specific coursework within the HIM curriculum. Upon completion, awarded the Bachelor of Science or Post-Bachelor's Certificate in Health Information Management with eligibility to sit for the RHIA credential exam through AHIMA
